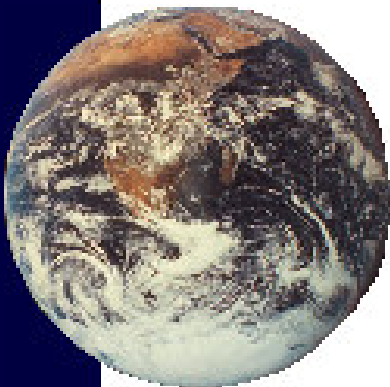

## Greetings from your Executive Director Filomena Brooks

Since our annual report has been sent to the National Council for International Visitors, I thought it would be of interest to our members to have a summary of the statistics for the year 2004. Our number of visitors was seventy eight (78). Our programmer Eloise Brown was very busy setting up eighty-seven (87) professional appointments. There were thirty-one home hospitalities. There were over 106 hotel nights used in the Tucson community. The amazing number for these visitors was the calculation of one-thousand-nine-hundred-eight days spent (1908) in Tucson. This includes the English Language officers and escorts.

Sometimes we don't realize how much our volunteer organization contributes in volunteer hours of service. An independent sector resource tabulates the value of each volunteer hour at \$17.19. With our total of 2415 hours for TCIV our council reported \$41,513.85.

I would like to thank Zora Zemsky for being our office volunteer on Thursdays. Eloise Brown and myself are often in the office on Wednesdays. If you would like to

spend a quiet 2 hours at the office between 9:00-11:30 a.m. Monday, Tuesday or Friday, please let me know. We have our computer for emails, fax machine and answering machine. However a real live person is always a great advantage in giving that personal touch.

Membership is always one of our major goals. Have you shared the message of Citizen Diplomacy with some of your friends and neighbors? Families with young children would truly benefit from meeting our international visitors. 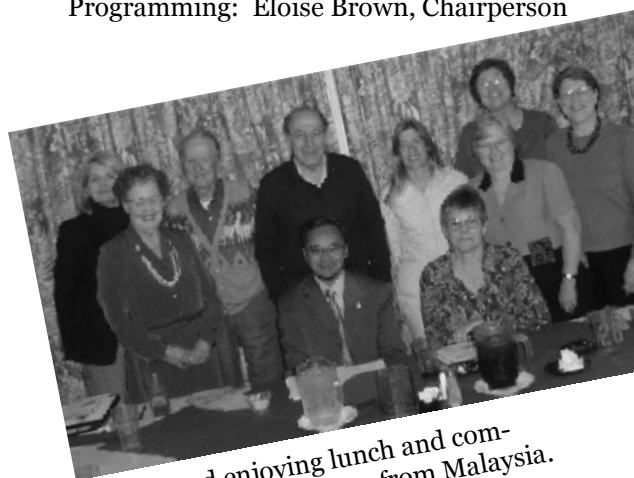
